

**MOTORIZED MITER BOX SAW
SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**

1. Be sure the saw blade is sharp, has proper clearance, and is free from vibration. If there are any problems with the blade, ask the instructor for assistance.
2. Always be sure your work is held firmly against the fence.
3. When cutting compound miters or crown molding, always use a filler block.
4. Do not cut bowed, twisted or warped material.
5. Tighten the arm lock knob before a cut is made. A loose knob can cause the blade to wander and give inaccurate cuts.
6. If the saw is equipped with a brake, be sure to release the trigger switch before you apply the saw brake. Most newer motorized miter box saws have an internal braking system. Ask your instructor for assistance if needed.
7. Be sure the machine is at a full stop before reaching to pick up a piece of work or anything that is in or near the cutting path of the blade.
8. Any cutting operation which requires a special set-up must be approved by the instructor prior to the start of the operation.
9. Do not place your fingers closer than four inches from the path of the saw blade.

If you are apprehensive about using this machine, have the instructor assist you.

Always wear approved eye protection while operating this machine.
